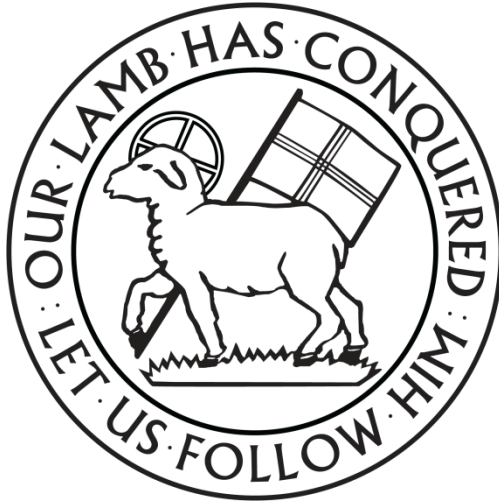

### **'Tis a Pleasant Thing to See: Fostering Respectful Conversation about Homosexuality and the Church**

You are warmly invited to attend a service of worship and prayer, focusing on our unity and diversity in the Moravian Church, planned and led by Bishops Graham Rights, Wayne Burkette, Sam Gray, and Lane Sapp. This service will be held on **Sunday, April 30, at 3:00 p.m., at Bethania Moravian Church**. This is one of a series of services sponsored by the Resolution 12 Steering Committee; others were held last September 25 and January 22. These services do not specifically address homosexuality, but rather are opportunities for worship and prayer together, seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit in all things. We seek to rejoice together in the things that bind us together as brothers and sisters in Christ, serving Christ and the world through the Moravian Church; we seek to worship our faithful, loving, and gracious Triune God; and we seek the wisdom, grace, and peace to know and follow God's will for the Moravian Church in all things.

Southern Province Synod Resolution 12 called for the province to "provide leadership, resources, and a process for a conversation about homosexuality in the church that includes diverse viewpoints, and opportunities for open and honest discussion, study and discernment. This process of dialogue and discernment should take into account similar efforts made, and decisions that have been or may be reached by our sister provinces within the Unity, as well as any actions of the 2014 Unity Board and 2016 Unity Synod." Fulfilling that mandate of Synod, the Provincial Elders Conference appointed a Steering Committee in the summer of 2014, which has been studying, praying, and working actively ever since.

**What is the purpose or "agenda" of the Resolution 12 Steering Committee?**

Given the directive of Synod, we have determined that *Our agenda is to encourage dialogue and provide new opportunities for the people of the Southern Province to discern more of the leadership of the Holy Spirit in our continued differences concerning homosexuality in the church. We believe through the study of scripture, the discipline of prayer, and the faith sharing of believers the Holy Spirit can provide each of us greater insight and clarity moving each of us to a deeper relationship with our Savior. In our deeper relationship with the Savior unity grows within our Province and our differences become smaller. In this task, we remember the words of Zinzendorf: "the nearer each one comes in knowing the Savior, the more enriched, more glad of heart, and more unwavering grows the communion among his members."*

Other **ongoing activities** relating to Resolution 12 are ...

1. ***Meetings with RCC's.*** The Resolution 12 Steering Committee would like to meet with Regional Conferences of Churches to talk about what we've been doing and what the next steps in our process will be. Each RCC can determine whether we meet only with the congregational representatives or with members of the congregations in a larger gathering. This won't be a discussion about what we feel about homosexuality, but rather a chance to bring everyone up to date and hear one another's questions and concerns as we move forward.
2. ***Preparation of a multi-part study/conversation guide for congregations and groups.*** Several of these sessions will include a 25-30-minute video with questions for discussion, and for the final session there will be questions for conversations. The first three of these are already available at <http://mcsp.org/resolution-12/video-series/>

We invite you to continue in prayer, that we all may be open and receptive to the presence and guidance of our Lord, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, as we work together as brothers and sisters in God's Moravian Church, Southern Province.

## **Encountered by Jesus**

On what road is Jesus encountering you?

As a few disciples walk and talk about what has happened, Jesus comes near and goes with them, but “their eyes were kept from recognizing him” (Luke 24:16). Jesus inquires about their discussion. They stand “still, looking sad.” What gives you pause, sadness? Cultivate the capacity to stand still, to confess how it really is (sad). It’s an honest antidote to the quick and false anger that characterizes the current time. Stillness, sadness, opens the way to Emmaus and other places of recognition.

What road are you on? Does it lead from blindness to sight, from disbelief to confession, from arrogance to humility, from self-centeredness to service, from sadness to joy?

The two talkers ask the “stranger” if he is the only one “who does not know the things that have taken place.” They speak about Jesus of Nazareth, of his life, death, and resurrection, and of their hope that he would have redeemed Israel. The text, however, moves quickly, refusing to linger in past disappointment. Jesus then encounters them more fully in their foolishness and slow hearts “to believe all that the prophets have declared.” I trust he encounters us in our foolishness.

Nearing the village, Jesus walks on. They invite him to stay. Luke notes urgency in their invitation. Does that same urgency characterize our faith, our invitations? “Stay with us, because the day is now nearly over.” He goes in and stays with them. The road has led to the table, where “he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him.”

May the Lord’s encounters leave us with “burning hearts,” to tell the story of resurrection and breaking bread, no matter what road we traverse.
