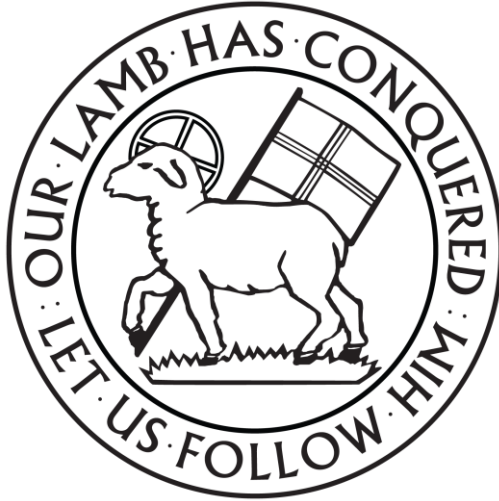

Hard Work

Growing up on a dairy farm was work. *Hard work*. You worked when the temperatures and the humidity were high and sweat ran into your eyeballs. You worked when the temperatures were low and the wind froze your snout. But you did it, because there was work to do. If you didn't do it, who was going to do it? The father in our Gospel today asked his sons to go work in the vineyard. One said yes, but didn't go to work. The other said no, but eventually went. The father knew there was work to do; someone needed to do the work. So he called his sons to tend the vines.

We have work to do . . . in our churches, in our communities, in our world. It's intimidating. There is a *lot* of work and it's *hard work*. There are some who would rather say no, but eventually see that the work needs to be done. Still there are others who say yes, but decide the actual physical part of the work is too much! However, the beauty of today is that we can remember we are not alone! Today of all days we can remember that there are many sons and daughters who have been called to work in the vineyards of our great God. We don't go to the fields alone. We go with each other, and most importantly we go with God.

The communion table is the best place to start before going on our way—the place where we remember Christ and the sacrifice made for us. The hope that is given to us. The place where we are made ready for the task at hand. World Communion is the day to remember we are not alone in the vineyards, doing the *hard work* for Christ.

**Conversations and Discernment
about Homosexuality and the Church**

**Reporting Forum and Service of Worship and Prayer
Sunday, October 8, 2017, 3:30 p.m.
Friedland Moravian Church**

Southern Province 2014 Synod Resolution 12 called upon the Provincial Elders Conference to “provide leadership, resources and a process for a conversation about homosexuality in the church that includes diverse viewpoints, and opportunities for open and honest discussion, study and discernment,” taking into account similar efforts and decisions of other provinces of the Moravian Unity. As part of this work, two different series of conversations have been held; two public forums sponsored, presenting contrasting views of homosexuality and Moravian interpretation of Scripture; a resource list and video series is available; and now it’s time to talk together about what has happened.

We invite you to come to a **report-out forum** on Sunday, October 8, 2017, at 3:30 p.m., at Friedland Moravian Church. As part of this event, we will talk about what has gone on these past three years, what we have heard and experienced, what questions have arisen, and what we hope we, as a province, have gained from this time of study and discernment.

Following our presentation, which will last about an hour to an hour and quarter, we will move into a **service of prayer and worship**, another in the series of services prepared and led by the bishops residing in the Southern Province. Earlier services were held last September, January, April and July.

This service, focusing on our call to mission and service, will include spoken and silent prayer, hymns, and scripture readings. There will be no sermon, but rather time to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit for the Moravian Church, Southern Province, as we seek to live as God’s faithful servants in the world today.

Please pass along this invitation to other members of the Moravian Church, Southern Province! Our province will benefit from the participation of *everyone* who wishes to worship together, celebrating the many things that unify us, most importantly our call to be brothers and sisters in Christ’s service through the Moravian Church.

Also please take advantage of the *video series* that has been prepared for congregations, Regional Conferences of Churches, or groups within your congregations. While our initial conception was for a six-session series, the series is now complete with four videos. Each has its own discussion guide, and there’s a leaders guide for the entire series. These are available at <http://mcspp.org/resolution-12/video-series/>. The video series is based upon the 2002 Unity Synod’s statement that homosexuality is a *biblical, theological, and pastoral* issue on which the church must dialogue. If you’d like a member of the committee to be with you as you watch the videos and talk, please contact us, and we’ll work with your schedule.

We ask for your continued prayer for the leadership of the Holy Spirit of Christ among us, as we, as Moravians in the Southern Province, seek to serve the world and to testify to the love of God in Christ, as brothers and sisters in Christ.
