Stay Flavored!

There is just something about salt! This multipurpose commodity comes in various forms, types, and colors. When used in the correct proportions, the kind used in meal preparation is usually for taste/ flavor enhancement. True, food prepared without it can be quite satisfying to the palette, but too much spoils the taste. Over time, ingesting too much contributes to ill health. So what did Jesus mean when he said to the disciples, “Everyone will be salted with fire. Salt is good; but if it loses its saltiness, how can you make it salty again?” (Mark 9:49–50 NIV). Certainly Jesus meant no harm toward them.

“Salted” Christians are matured in their faith and should therefore display exemplary lives earning the respect of others. Non-Christians should be eager to emulate us. “Salted” Christians should live peacefully and harmoniously with each other, have unwavering faith, and be kind and caring. Those on the outside should be able to readily say that “they are different” in a good way. When asked, we should proudly proclaim, “Yes, we are disciples of Christ!” not denying our Savior. By our deeds they should know we are Christians. As “salted” followers of Christ, we are commissioned to be preserved and flavored with God’s grace and mercy; to be sanctified and armed with the word of God, as ambassadors for Christ. The tenets of goodness and upright living should exude from our pores. When Jesus says, “Have salt among yourselves,” it is a charge to stand out in the crowd; to show love to our brothers and sisters and not be judgmental; to be in this world yet not of the world.

Let us therefore remain flavored in our Christian faith; be salted and preserved with the word of God; and be at peace with each other.

Important announcement regarding 2019 Flower Reservations. By action of the Board of Elders in 2012, the Flower Calendar Reservation Procedure **for 2019 goes into effect next Sunday, October 7.** Beginning that Sunday, you may make reservations for 2019 (for either the sanctuary and/or the narthex) by signing up using the **2019 Flower Reservation Notebook** which will be located on the lectern next to the Sanctuary piano (below the Good Shepherd stained glass window). For members who cannot be present for worship on October 7 (residents or non-residents), you may sign up via e-mail or phone to the church office beginning at **8:30 a.m. on Monday, October 8.** Reservations will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis. ***Please be aware that existing 2018 reservations DO NOT automatically become valid for 2019. You must sign up again for the new year.***

Next Sunday, October 7, will be the Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost and the day when we will be observing ***World Communion Sunday.*** We will share together in the Sacrament of Holy Communion during worship.

On Sunday, October 14, after worship, we will have our ***October Second Sunday*** event. Calvary will be hosting a neighborhood picnic on the front lawn to share our 125th Anniversary joy with our local community in the Holly Avenue Historic District and surrounding blocks. WHAT IS A DIENER?

In the Moravian tradition, dieners (derived from the German verb, dienen) serve the lovefeast during services of worship.

The lovefeast, dating to the New Testament agape meal, is not a sacrament like Holy Communion; rather, it is a fellowship meal symbolizing our unity in Christ. The meal is simple, usually consisting of a sweetened bun and a cup of coffee. After everyone is served, the congregation prays the blessing and partakes.

Lovefeast is observed on special occasions during the Church Year, particularly at Christmas, during Holy Week, and on Thanksgiving. Lovefeasts also may be served for mission occasions and church anniversaries.

Dieners play a very important role in the service of lovefeast. The women dressed plainly in white and the men dressed in dark coats are to convey simplicity in their dress as they represent the Christ “who came not to be served, but to serve.”
