Part of the Same Body

Today around the world many congregations are sharing Holy Communion. I enjoy the thought of Christians everywhere thinking about one point that we can agree on: Holy Communion. On this Sunday, I remember Christ is the head of one body (Ephesians 4:15–16). Though we divide ourselves by denominations and regions, we are still part of the same body of Christ. I have had the privilege to give and to receive Communion in many different denominations, each with its own rituals and forms. Even within our own Moravian denomination (for example, Alberta, Labrador, Michigan, Ohio, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Nepal, South Africa), there are many differences.

Christians seem to spend a lot of time separating ourselves from one another. On this day, however, for about twenty-four hours there is Communion happening somewhere, a reminder, to me, of what binds us together. We are all part of the body. We can attack one another, but our health comes from working together and from acknowledging that Jesus Christ is the head of everyone (of every denomination and country) who is a Christian.

Whether we sip wine from a cup or drink juice from a tiny glass, whether we break bread or a wafer, we are remembering Jesus—his life, death, and resurrection so that the world may know salvation. We are bound under one head: Jesus Christ.

WHAT IS A DIENER?

In the Moravian tradition, dieners (derived from the German verb, dienen) serve the lovefeast during services of worship.

The lovefeast, dating to the New Testament agape meal, is not a sacrament like Holy Communion; rather, it is a fellowship meal symbolizing our unity in Christ. The meal is simple, usually consisting of a sweetened bun and a cup of coffee. After everyone is served, the congregation prays the blessing and partakes.

Lovefeast is observed on special occasions during the Church Year, particularly at Christmas, during Holy Week, and on Thanksgiving. Lovefeasts also may be served for mission occasions and church anniversaries.

Dieners play a very important role in the service of lovefeast. The women dressed plainly in white and the men dressed in dark coats are to convey simplicity in their dress as they represent the Christ “who came not to be served, but to serve.”

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We, the Strategic Planning Committee, deeply appreciate the work and input you have contributed to our congregation's strategic planning process over the last 18 months. We are grateful to all of you who responded to the invitation to participate directly, by submitting idea cards and joining brainstorming teams this summer. Most of those ideas have been fleshed out and compiled into a planning binder, which can be viewed in the front office by anyone at any time.

If you have not yet gotten involved but would like to, it is not too late. We invite you bring any ideas, comments, questions, or concerns to the committee or to any of the brainstorming team leaders. We are still (and hopefully always will be) in a spirit of exploration and creation of new ideas and concepts, and a strategic plan for Calvary will only work if it represents our entire church family. Each of you matters!

Now we would like to bring you an exciting update on the process. Rest assured that the work has neither slowed nor halted. The process takes time, but there is a great deal of work being done behind the scenes. The Strategic Planning Committee has continued to meet regularly, and on Monday, September 17, we presented the Joint Board with a draft proposal—a proposal that, among other things, directly incorporates all of the wonderful contributions of the congregation.

At this time, that proposal is not a public document, and we ask for your understanding as we keep the details of the proposal under wraps for a short while longer. Board members are prayerfully reviewing, discussing, and possibly amending the draft. No decisions have been made about this proposed strategic plan, but it will be discussed in detail during the Joint Board meeting scheduled for October 15.

We know you are all eager for more details, so we ask that you mark your calendars for a very important Church Council meeting on Sunday, November 4. We cannot stress enough how important that date will be. That will be the day you will hear in greater detail about proposed plans and considerations for our church as we move forward in the coming years.

Please continue to pray that God will make his will known so that we can discern and follow the path he has laid out for us.


