Pastor's Corner—October

from Pastor Chaz

Life Together in a World Apart

We have spent a lot of time as a church talking about what it means to be a community during these uncertain times of the COVID-19 pandemic. This has been a moment in history that has called our attention to what it means to be connected as humans. It has disrupted even the very basic notion of being in physical groups with one another.

As a society we have adapted how we do things to meet this threat, but what I find now is that all of this can become very exhausting. I don't know about you, but there have been days when I have found myself more tired than normal even though I may have been "doing" less. I believe part of this tiredness comes from that fact that we find ourselves running a marathon instead of sprint.

We as a society quickly banded together to try to keep one another safe, but now we find ourselves in it for the long haul. And that can be exhausting. So how do we stay in the race? How do we make sure we have what it takes to keep going in this world that feels so apart at times?

We want to wrestle with some of those questions in our first online book group at Calvary. We will read together Dietrich Bonhoeffer's classic text Life Together. It is his reflection on living in community during Germany's most challenging time as a nation.

Every other week there will be a video to watch, which details the chapters and some discussion topics, followed by an online zoom discussion the next week. There is also a private Facebook page for just those in the book group. This is a way for people to feel safer about sharing their thoughts and opinions.

The arrival of October is announced by the ever-changing colors of the leaves, the cooler weather, and especially the notable increase in activities associated with the fall and upcoming holiday seasons. True, the pandemic has forced a number of changes to our traditional programming. However, we are continuing to add new exciting opportunities. There is still much to look forward to, in addition to praying that this crisis will be over as soon as possible!

This October, there are *four* Sundays during the month. We begin the month with the annual observance of World Communion on Sunday, October 4, which will be the 18th Sunday after Pentecost. Holy Communion will be shared during worship at 11:00 a.m. Since we are not worshipping yet in person, you are invited to share Holy Communion in your own homes with the elements you have there.

Sunday, October 11, will be the 19th Sunday after Pentecost. The next Sunday, October 18, will be the 20th Sunday after Pentecost. The last Sunday in October is the 25th, the 21st Sunday after Pentecost.

In spite of the current health crisis, we still have a busy October and fall 2020 before us.

Maxims from Monsieur Paul:

"Jesus does not mind one bit."



During recent vacation time, I was able to see the latest version of the Titanic story, about the famous liner that went down on its maiden voyage in 1912. This version was written by Julian Fellowes, the author of Downtown Abbey, so I knew that it would be good. While remaining very historically accurate, this version was far more emotional than previous treatments of the story, focusing more on the difference between the classes, the rigid standards of conduct and prejudices that were present during the Edwardian period, and the angst, terror, sorrow, and loss that was felt by **all** classes on that fateful night. The passengers aboard were a true mix of humanity at the time, from self-made and inherited millionaires, to the poorest of immigrants, the latter who had paid \$350-\$900 (in 2020 dollars), literally their entire life savings, for a chance at a better life in America.

Some, but certainly not all, of the first class passengers were, as one might call them, "high maintenance," demanding the best of services, which certainly was not surprising given first class ticket prices which started at \$3,500 in today's currency, a lot of money in 1912. Importantly though, some of these passengers were particularly distrustful and resentful of anyone not in their social classes. They were particularly glad that second class and third class (a.k.a. steerage) were physically separated from them, often by lock and key, and could not enter first class without permission. However, on Sunday morning, April 14, the Titanic relaxed these restrictions long enough to allow ALL passengers to attend an interdenominational service in the first class dining saloon. People from all classes attended. In the version I was watching, some of the first class passengers were not happy to see other classes allowed in to "their worship." One passenger said, "I can't believe they are allowing second class, servants, and steerage into our service. I think it is disgraceful." Another passenger, the wife of an English Earl, and thus very high in



society said, "And some of these people look suspiciously Catholic." The Earl responded much more charitably, "I don't think Jesus minds one bit"

Let's resist the temptation to be too hard on the first class passengers, thinking of them as snobby, conceited people who thought themselves better than others. Even in 2020, any one of us can, at any point in time, be just as snobby and conceited. The current divisive environment is rife with examples of this. Romans 12:16 is instructive: "Live in harmony with each other. Do not be arrogant, but associate with humble people. Do not think that you are wiser than you really are" (International Standard version). The Earl was right: Jesus doesn't mind a bit. He DOES mind when we do not treat others with respect and fairly. He DOES mind when we criticize and condemn others with whom we disagree. He DOES mind when we don't treat our fellow sisters and brothers with love.

More and more every day, I see "Black lives matter" signs popping up in many places. I am very glad to see these signs, but I am not glad for the divisiveness, violence, and deaths that have preceded them and show no sign of stopping. Guess what? Not only do black lives matter, lives of all colors matter. Chinese lives matter. Australian lives matter. Indian lives matter. American lives matter. Every other country's lives matter. Straight and gay lives matter. Catholic, Muslim, Hindu, and protestant lives matter. There is NO LIFE that does not matter to our Savior.

The phrase, "What would Jesus do?" or WWJD, is often used. The thought is right on target. However, I personally prefer, "What would the *Savior* do?" which acknowledges that our loving Lord died on the cross for our salvation.

Can we do anything less than "act like him"?

Trustees' Update-September

The Calvary Board of Trustees last met on September 21, 2020 via ZOOM.

The Trustees were joined on ZOOM by Bonnie Suther of UBS in Winston-Salem. Bonnie gave an update on the process of moving investment accounts from Wells Fargo to UBS. The Calvary Moravian Investment funds are now at UBS in a PACE account (actively managed for nonprofits). Bonnie went over details about the percentages in various types of market investments such as Equities, Bonds, and others. We plan to create an Investment sub-committee under the Trustees which will work closely with UBS going forward. However, Bonnie Suther will continue to update the Trustees directly as well.

The next meeting of the Trustees is planned for *Monday, October 19*, following the Joint Board meeting at 6:30 p.m. The meeting will be done via ZOOM. *CC

Update on Calvary's Fall Church Council

Knowing that COVID-19 would present various obstacles for convening congregational Council meetings this fall, the Provincial Elders' Conference recently sent a letter containing suggested guidelines



The PEC consulted parliamentarians and legal counsel in formulating these guidelines so any of their suggestions to congregations were in compliance with the provincial constitution and its rules and regulations.

After reviewing this material, the Joint Board of Calvary Moravian Church decided to use the guideline outlined in Option #1 of the PEC's September 3, 2020 letter:

- The PEC has recommended congregations arrange to have a minimal congregation council designated only to fulfill the requirement to hold an annual meeting.
- A limited number of church board members will be attending this council on behalf of the congregation (held by ZOOM). Church Members are not expected to attend due to Phase 2.5 limitations. There will not be a quorum.
- The one and only item of business at this meeting will be: a motion to adjourn after setting a date for the next congregational council (PEC recommends sometime in the first quarter of 2021)

This means that current board members whose terms are expiring December 31, 2020 will remain in office until their successors are elected at the next scheduled council meeting.

The Nominating Committee has already met and will continue to meet to prepare a ballot of nominees for election at the next scheduled council. *CC

Calvary Advent and Christmas 2020



The letter below was sent to Calvary's current email list on September 23.

In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Joint Board recently approved an exciting and creative plan for celebrating the Advent and Christmas season.

As you know, we have continued to follow the guidance of our Provincial Elders' Conference and our state government in making decisions regarding the resumption of "inperson" worship. As we hopefully move toward Phase 3 in the coming weeks, the Joint Board will again consider "in person" worship opportunities. Our goal is to act responsibly and to carefully safeguard the health and well-being of the Calvary congregation.

That being said, our Advent and Christmas services have been planned so they can be used with an in-person or live stream audience. However, the Joint Board decided that two of these services, Sunday, December 13, and Christmas Eve, December 24, will need to be pre-recorded or live streamed with no inperson participation.

The Christmas Eve Lovefeast and Candle service will be recorded ahead of time and made available to you for viewing anytime on Christmas Eve via YouTube and Facebook. We are working on plans now for the possible distribution of candles for you to use in your homes when you join us for this virtual Christmas celebration. More details will follow in the coming weeks.

Though we realize that this news will be disappointing, we believe it is necessary to safeguard the health and well-being of our congregation and the wider community who shares this celebration with us each year.

While we are deeply saddened to be unable to celebrate the Christmas lovefeast together in person this year, we hope you will help us connect as many people as possible to this special lovefeast-at-a-distance. 
