During November each year, we typically mark three important events: the Festival of Christ the Chief Elder; Reign of Christ Sunday; and our annual Thanksgiving Lovefeast. And since it is November, we also know we will soon welcome the season of Advent by singing the "Hosanna" anthem and thus begin our celebration of the wonderful Advent and Christmas seasons. It is indeed a very busy. and wonderful, time of the year, although it WILL be different, unfortunately, due to the current pandemic.

There are four Sundays in November 2020. Sunday, November 1, is the 22nd Sunday after Pentecost. It is also All Saints' Day. On this day, we commemorate all the saints of the church, both known and unknown, which have attained heaven. The second Sunday in November, the 8th, will be the day when we observe and celebrate the Festival of Christ the Chief Elder. We will share in the Sacrament of Holy Communion on that day.

November 15 is the 24th Sunday after Pentecost. And on November 22, we will observe Reign of Christ Sunday and share in our Thanksgiving Lovefeast. Members are invited to choose lovefeast elements and enjoy in their own homes.

Last but not least, Sunday, November 29, will be the First Sunday of Advent. We will pray the traditional Advent liturgy and sing the "Hosanna" anthem. The first "Advent Afternoon" music program will be broadcast at 2:00 p.m.

We hope you will be able to take advantage of our November services and events. On Sunday mornings, join us for the live stream broadcast of the 11:00 a.m. service.

Maxims from Monsieur Paul:

"Persevering through a Difficult Time"

Paul's Maxim for November 2020: "Keep going!"

One evening in October 2011, I had the TV on when I heard the dreaded words, "We interrupt this program for a special bulletin...." Ever since the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in November 1963, such announcements have a way of stopping you in your tracks, and certainly this one got my attention. The bulletin announced the death of Apple Corporation founder Steve Jobs. The news was not particularly a surprise, given the extensive coverage of his multi-year battle with cancer. It was a shock nonetheless, due to his international reputation and especially his fierce determination to keep on living, far longer than the doctors expected.

The next day, many news channels replayed stories about him, including his notable 2005 speech at Stanford University's graduation when he said something like this: "Sometimes life hits you like a brick...don't lose faith." Certainly, Jobs did not lose faith. In spite of having one of the most deadly cancers known, he kept on going; he kept on innovating, creating new things. He was "there"...meaning he was present. He was "life-focused," trying to help people by creating new things that would make their lives easier and more enjoyable. He did not "fade away": he showed up! He "kept going" right up until his very end.

You might ask, "What does all of this have to do with the month of November?" During this month at Calvary and elsewhere in the Moravian Church, we have two very significant occasions to celebrate: the Festival of Christ the Chief Elder (this year, November 8); and Reign of Christ Sunday (November 22). For Moravians, the Chief Elder Festival is particularly important. It was in 1741 when the head of the Moravian Church, Leonard Dober, determined that being the leader of a far-flung and ever-growing church was just too big of a job. At a meeting in London in September 1741, Dober and



fellow church leaders wondered if the would be willing to be Chief Elder. The question was put to the lot, and the answer was "yes." It was decided the celebration of this wonderful news would be November 13, 1741, to allow time for the news to reach all areas of the Unity. In our time of "instant news," it's hard to imagine waiting for two months for news to get around. But this news for Moravians was BIG, just as big as the news of Kennedy's assassination, Jobs' death, or any other event that "stops us in our tracks." The Moravian Church did not sit on its laurels when Dober gave up the Chief Eldership to the Savior. One of the most important missionary efforts in history continued, resulting today in a Moravian Church that is literally worldwide. And each of us continues to benefit from this.

We find ourselves weighed down from this year's pandemic, and based on current trends, we know it is going to get worse before it gets better. This health crisis has literally stopped us in our tracks. This is no time to sit on our hands or become complacent. It is time for us to "pull ourselves up by our own bootstraps," get going, and keep moving. We need to persevere! While continuing to exercise all the proper recommended precautions against the virus, we need to be *active*....active in continuing to reach out to others, to share the love of Christ. Our responsibilities as Christians and Moravians do not go away during difficult times.

I mentioned one other important event this month. On November 22, we will observe and celebrate Reign of Christ Sunday. On this day, we acknowledge Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior and our King "who came in quietness and humility, but who will come again with power and for all to see." Let us remember that as our Savior came with power, we too have the power to help and minister to others. Like Leonard Dober, like Steve Jobs, and most importantly, like our Savior, let us "keep going!" *CC

Calvary Advent and Christmas 2020

The letter below was sent to Calvary's current email list on September 23.

In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Joint Board recently approved an exciting and creative plan for celebrating the Advent and Christmas season.

As you know, we have continued to follow the guidance of our Provincial Elders' Conference and our state government in making decisions regarding the resumption of "inperson" worship. As we hopefully continue in Phase 3 in the coming weeks, the Joint Board will again consider "in person" worship opportunities. Our goal is to act responsibly and to carefully safeguard the health and well-being of the Calvary congregation.

That being said, our Advent and Christmas services have been planned so they can be used with an in-person or live stream audience. However, the Joint Board decided that two of these services, Sunday, December 13, and Christmas Eve, December 24, will need to be pre-recorded or live streamed with no inperson participation.

The Christmas Eve Lovefeast and Candle service will be recorded ahead of time and made available to you for viewing anytime on Christmas Eve via YouTube and Facebook. We are working on plans now for the possible distribution of candles for you to use in your homes when you join us for this virtual Christmas celebration. More details will follow in the coming weeks.

Though we realize that this news will be disappointing, we believe it is necessary to safeguard the health and well-being of our congregation and the wider community who shares this celebration with us each year.
