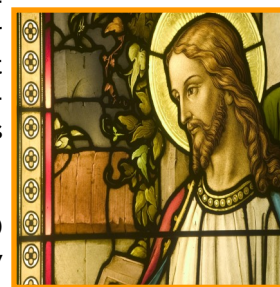


## Pastor's Corner—January

As the New Year dawns this January 1st, we awake to the last few days of the Christmas season and the beginning of the season of Epiphany.

The first day of 2021 will occur on a Friday (*a holiday; Church Office will be closed*). The first Sunday in the new year will be **January 3**. This will be the **Second Sunday after Christmas** and just a few days prior to the **Epiphany of our Lord on January 6**. On January 3, we will share together in the Sacrament of Holy Communion in celebration of Epiphany. Epiphany is the last day of what we know as the "Twelve Days of Christmas."

Throughout January, we have the opportunity and the time to ponder the significance of Christ's birth and what his birth means to each of us. **Sunday, January 10**, will be the **First Sunday after the Epiphany**. This is also the day when we traditionally observe the Baptism of our Lord.

This January, we will have **three additional Sundays** during which we will explore the meaning of Epiphany and the promise of salvation secured for us in Christ's birth: **January 17, January 24, and January 31**. These Sundays will be, respectively, the **Second, Third, and Fourth** Sundays after the Epiphany.

The Epiphany hymn text by Henry J. Pye (1825-1903) may direct our thoughts this Epiphany season: "Jesus, by your presentation, when they blessed you, weak and poor, make us see your great salvation, seal us with your promise sure."

**We hope you will be able to take advantage of our January services and events.** On Sunday mornings, join us for the live stream broadcast of the 11:00 a.m. service.

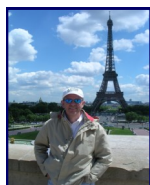

## *Maxims from Monsieur Paul:* “Second star to the right, and straight on till morning!”

In the December 2010 “*Calvary Connection*,” newsletter, my first newsletter as Calvary’s new Administrative Assistant, I started a column called, “Maxims from Monsieur Paul,” recalling my years of living and studying in Paris. I mentioned *Wikipedia’s* definition of a maxim as a “short statement which is notable in one respect or another and which expresses wisdom or truth.” I also mentioned that my use of “maxims” reminded me of François VI, Duc de la Rochefoucauld (1613-1680), who was an accomplished nobleman and famous writer of “maxims” and memoirs. Monsieur de la Rochefoucauld lived a century before another accomplished nobleman, our Moravian Church’s own Count Nicholas von Zinzendorf (1700-1760). Zinzendorf also could be known to provide folks with maxims of his own creation, some of which he laid down as law for the Herrnhut community living on his Saxony, Germany estate.

When I started writing my own maxims that December long ago, I promised that my maxims would not “provide new undiscovered truths or wisdom,” nor did I wish for them to be “complex or cynical” as some of La Rochefoucauld’s are. I said I would like for them to be helpful and provide hope, a commodity each one of us needs daily. I have written a maxim in the Calvary monthly newsletter every month since December 2010, and I hope that at least some of them have been entertaining and possibly instructive.

As January 2021 begins, I find myself at the “changing of the guard,” transitioning my responsibilities to a new office and communications manager, who, I confidently believe, will successfully pick up the baton. I know that I can count on the Calvary congregation and staff to be supportive and helpful, as you all have been to me for more than 10 years.

Every January as we begin the season of Epiphany, it’s perfectly understandable and natural if we catch ourselves looking at

the stars. The Three Wise Men were told to follow a star, which led them to the infant Jesus. They arrived at the manger on the twelfth day after the Savior’s birth, which is called Epiphany. On these winter January nights, we may also find ourselves looking at the stars, which can seem even brighter than normal in the cold and clear sky. Perhaps we are looking for answers, for change or hoping for change, especially in these pandemic times, or perhaps we are experiencing change ourselves. Or maybe we are wondering “What’s out there?” and “When will we see it or know it?” The Winter solstice having passed, we know that the days will progressively get lighter. In the bleakness of these pandemic times, it’s good that we spend some time “*looking for the light.*”

As I prepare to depart Calvary and as a devoted “Star Trekkie,” I recall the last days of the starship Enterprise with Captain James T. Kirk at the helm. At the end of the 1991 film, “The Undiscovered Country,” the Enterprise receives its decommissioning orders. Kirk wistfully remarks, “This is the final cruise of the starship Enterprise under my command. This ship and her history will shortly become the care of another crew. To them and their posterity will we commit our futures. They will continue the voyages that we have begun and journey to all the undiscovered countries....”

What is yours, what is my, “undiscovered country”? What’s next? Where are we going? I do not know. But for now, I am content to *look for the light*, and simply echo the words of Peter Pan and Captain Kirk: “Second star on the right, and straight on till morning!”

- ◆ Teresa Drummond, our real estate manager has found tenants to fill the 3 spots that were vacated due to COVID. So Holly Ave rental is full. She has all but 3 (the 3 new tenants) on multi year rental agreements now.
- ◆ Nursery renovations: The painting is almost done and the flooring materials have arrived at Faulkner Flooring, and Brad at Faulkner will schedule delivery in December.
- ◆ The Heat Exchanger for the 3rd floor hall (Chaz and Sabrina area) has been ordered by SHAC (Stanley) who will schedule the work with Gordon as soon as equipment ships.
- ◆ The Playground area was mulched in early December, and Salem Presbyterian folks have expressed their thanks and appreciation. Note: They continue to hold their Sunday evening services on our lawn and they have continued paying their rent throughout the COVID months.

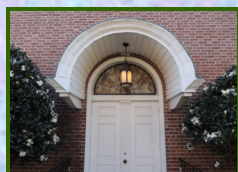

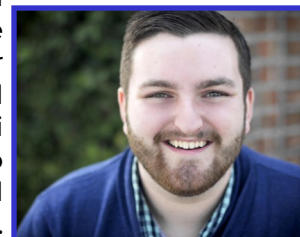

## Joint PEC Statement following the 2020 Election

We greet you in the name of Jesus, Chief Elder of the Church and Savior of our lives. Members of the Southern and Northern Province Provincial Elders' Conferences held our annual gathering on November 11-12, 2020 via Zoom. During our time together, we prayed for the witness of our congregations, met with the heads of the agencies that serve our common ministry, and explored ways to work together more collaboratively. We prayed for those who have been horrifically impacted by COVID-19, for those who grieve, suffer, and for those who are researching for an effective vaccine and planning for a speedy, equitable distribution of such a vaccine. We met in the context of the US election and prayed for a spirit of healing and unity in the country. We found hope in the good news that Jesus is Chief Elder throughout time and is not up for election every four years.

Our mission is to equip people and congregations to be agents of God's transforming love in the world. How might we, in this divided political landscape, be agents of God's transforming love to our neighbors in God's world? How might we offer a spirit of hospitality and humility of heart and mind, all while looking for the face of Christ in the other? How might we live out the goal of unity articulated in the Moravian Covenant for Christian Living? We profess that we all are made in the image of God, and collectively seek what is best for God's world. The fact that we may have a different understanding of 'what is best' can be a cause for creative discourse – or bitter contempt. As followers of the Prince of Peace, we call on Moravians across both provinces to choose creative discourse, to choose the way of peace, to seek common ground, not for the sake of a political party, but for the sake of our Christian witness and for the sake of the world.

We acknowledge, in this election year, that the United States is deeply divided. We are grateful that we live in a country where we are allowed to vote our conscience without fear of reprisal or

harm. Our faith invites us to weep with those who mourn and rejoice with those who celebrate. We acknowledge that a statement from provincial leaders will not end the bitter divisions that grip the country; yet we pray that a reminder of our primary call as citizens of the heavenly realm will invite us to talk through our differences so that we might walk in unity and hope in the days and months ahead. Our desire and capacity to work – and walk – together, despite our differences, forms part of our witness of faith.

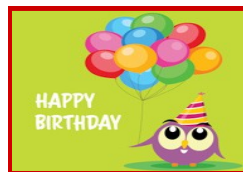

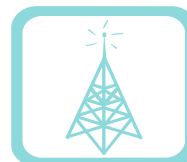

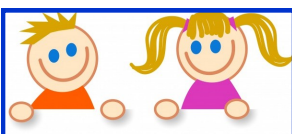
