You supply the needs of all who honor you; you hear their cries and save them. We will ever praise you, Lord; let all creation praise your holy name forever.




(Kneeling or sitting)

There is no condemnation now for those who live in union with Christ Jesus. Hear the word of our Lord: I do not condemn you. Go, but do not sin again.


(Standing)
